





gon here. You know, in our latest Ghostbusters movie the famous ocean liner. the Titanic, finally reaches New York, only 77 years behind schedule. But Dr. Robert Ballard didn't wait for the Ti-

tanic to come to him-his research crew actually discovered the shipwreck in 1985, a mile below the ocean's surface! They explored the wreckage using a remotecontrolled robot named JA-SON.

This year Dr. Ballard and IASON had another adventure, diving more than a mile under the Mediterranean Sea to explore active underwater volcanoes and ancient shipwrecks. This time, though, they took 250,000 kids with them! Whew! I'm glad I didn't have to pack their lunches!

Actually, the quarter of a million extra adventurers were safe, sound, and dry at a dozen museums in the U.S. and Canada. But they could see everything the underwater explorers saw, and they could even talk to them directly. Dr. Ballard used a satellite hook-up that sent sound and pictures between the kids at home and the researchers 88,000 miles away-all in less than half a second! This was the first time ever that live TV signals were sent from the bottom of the sea to audiences in North America.

Back at the museums, students saw a full-scale recreation of the control center used by Dr. Ballard's team on the research vessel. Large screen projection TVs were used to show live pictures from the ship. The JASON Project lasted two weeks, but now that the technology is in place, more programs that let students look over the shoul-



ders of researchers are planned for the future.

Maybe I should call Dr. Ballard and ask to borrow IA-SON for our next Real Ghostbusters assignment. Let's see-the robot has three color video cameras, a 35millimeter still camera and its own high-powered lighting system. It has sonar, and seven thrusters for positioning the robot just where you want it. Sounds great! But wait ... he's seven feet long and weighs 2400 pounds-hmmm, maybe not! Ecto-I is hard enough to get around the city streets.

I guess JASON will just have to be happy seeing what he can see at sea, while The Real Ghostbusters keep the spooks in hand up here on land!
